Teams will play at community locations throughout the cities for championships and community fundraising, building community brotherhood and competition without violence.



PATHWAY PASS PRISON PROJECT

Each Community Unit will have a structured pathway planned for them. To bypass the Blackman to prison bridge, we will utilize the Community Units to end the programmed destruction of the community. Instead we use the Community Unit to restructure, rebuild, and rebrand the Blackman.









COMMUNITY UNIT DOCTOR/LAWYER POLICY

Each community unit will be required from top ranked OG to have at least:

1 DOCTOR 1 LAWYER

The Community Unit will protect and provided assistance to the chosen individuals so that they may return to that community and serve the families of the Community Units years later.

Neighborhood Watch

WIRELESS NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROJECT

The Wireless Neighborhood Watch Project will allow all members to have active networking and visual sharing systems. These systems will use drones to connect in real-time: allowing drones that may lose frequency to be replaced with another one that was previously following cars from neighborhood to the neighborhood. This system will allow neighborhood watch members to provide 24/7 drone security and monitoring throughout the neighborhood: switching from neighbor to neighbor with live cloud save functions.



NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH: YOUTH STREET DROIDS

Street droids will allow the Neighborhood Watch to keep surveillance for playing children, community events in neighborhood parties and hangouts. It will also be used as a deterrent of drive-by shootings. Droids will also produce a live feed system that every Neighborhood Watch member can view. The Neighborhood Watch Youth Street droids will also be placed at parks and high-risk locations for the safety of the youth and the community.



GUNSHOT DETECTION VANS WITH DRONES



G.D.Vs will take over as drones are equipped with the gunshot detection systems and live access to the neighborhood watch cloud.
G.D.Vs will assist law enforcement with the process of security and capture.





PORTABLE NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH BOOTHS



NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH BOOTHS

Utilizing several portable camera, drone, and secured security booths. For safety, booths will have gun proofing at all day locations. They will also be placed in areas such as parks and through the duration of special community events.



NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH COMMUNITY TACTICAL TEAM



To support community units' assistance in the neighborhood, each member will receive support in the form of a firearm certificate, metal detector and a partnership with the local motorcycle club.








VIOLENCE REBOUND PEN-PAL PROJECT

The REBOUND PEN-PAL PROJECT will introduce to one another the families to young men and women in the foster care system or youth whose parents may be imprisoned. In the process, extended family members are allowed to be introduced were family has been lost or removed. This is to build community bonds where unfortunate events have displaced families. We are looking to take the broken glass from all frames and build a community of forgiveness that can look in the mirror and feel proud.

With one simple app, a family can read the story of another family and develop a community bond of healing. It will be an app where former gang members can become community adopted sons of the mothers of slain black men across the community.




REPORT CARD COMMUNITY UNIT PROGRAM
